hristened the youngest fusion band in Asia, 'Oxygen', an instrumental fusion band from Chennai released their second album titled Dimensions recently. The band has Girinand on the western keyboard, Harish on the carnatic keyboard, Karthick on the violin, Suresh on the flute, Bharat Ram and Raghu on bass guitar, Prithvi on the drums, Ramana on the mridangam, Anirudh on the kanjira and Videep on the lead guitar.

Like most teenagers, the members of the band are caught up in their studies, examinations and career options. But it is their love for music that has made them achieve such great heights. Girinand says, "Our music is an instrumental mix of carnatic and western tunes. We don't do covers, our music is individual and spontaneous. I usually come up with the basic tune and play it to the guys and they add to it."
